About Bristol Old Vic



Led by Executive Director **Charlotte Geeves** and Artistic Director **Nancy Medina**, with investment from Arts Council England, Bristol Old Vic is committed to creating opportunities for new voices and artists, and to present an increasingly diverse programme of stories that Bristol UK has to offer on our stages.

From its extensively redeveloped building in the Old City, Bristol Old Vic offers a year-round theatre programme of inspiring, original new stage work.

Most recently this has included the European premiere of Matthew López's play <u>Reverberation</u>, Gareth Farr's new play <u>A Child of Science</u>, the new musical <u>Starter for Ten</u>, the UK revival of Tarell Alvin McCraney's <u>Choir Boy</u>, Nkenna Akunna's <u>cheeky little brown</u> with tiata fahodzi, and the original staging and 2024 UK tour of <u>Wonder Boy</u>.

Bristol Old Vic is home to one of UK theatre's biggest <u>learning and engagement</u> programmes working across the city through pioneering <u>outreach projects</u> as well as creating major community productions on its stages like <u>Orpheus & Eurydice</u> with a cast of over 150 Bristolians; and one of the UK's leading artist development programmes.

Our <u>Artist Development</u> programme was relaunched in 2024 which includes a five-year commitment to new writing. <u>Winsome Pinnock</u> was announced as Bristol Old Vic's first Legacy Writer.

Through Bristol Old Vic <u>On Screen</u>, audiences across the world have seen its productions live, on demand in cinemas, and on broadcast television. In 2023 this included the US/UK cinema screening of <u>Hamlet</u>, Sky Arts broadcasts such as <u>Touching the Void</u>, and live broadcast of <u>Drive Your Plow Over The Bones of The Dead</u> in partnership with Complicité.

In <u>2023/24</u> Bristol Old Vic welcomed over 135,000 ticket holders, distributed 4,500 tickets to communities and schools across Bristol and delivered activity for over 15,000 participants.



About STAGE ONE

BRISTOL OLD VIC

Stage One is a charity that has supported theatre producers and productions through educational and investment schemes for over 40 years through a series of developmental programmes ranging from practical workshops to financial awards.

Stage One offers a variety of development programmes for emerging commercial producers. As well as offering paid placements we run 3 annual workshops, we offer bursary of up to £20k, and offer underrepresented producers access to our Bridge the Gap development programme. We also provide investment to producers on both small scale and larger commercial investment.

Stage One Producer Placements

The Stage One Producer Placements offer aspiring producers the opportunity to work within an established production company or producing theatre. They are employed by the organisation for 12 months, learning the producer role through hand-on training. Stage One launched the national branch of this scheme in 2013 in order to increase communication and shared knowledge across the subsidised and commercial sectors. The placement not only benefits the producer, but also the host theatre/ organisation as they have further opportunity and support to produce inhouse.

Since 2006 Stage One have facilitated:

- 120 paid placements in West End commercial producing offices to 87 producers
- 38 paid placements in national theatres and host venues (launched in 2013)
- 4 Bridge the Gap placements at Talawa
 Theatre Company (2021-22), Gate Theatre
 (2022-23), Leeds Playhouse (2023-24) and Lyric
 Hammersmith Theatre (2024-25).

Contract: Full time, 12-month fixed term

Hours: Your normal hours of work are 35 hours per week to be worked within the core hours of 08.00am - 18.00pm Monday to Friday, although you may have to work such additional hours as reasonably required by the Employer.

About The Role

Key Duties and Responsibilities

This is an opportunity for a committed aspiring producer to gain experience and offer insight into a busy and ambitious theatre. The Stage One Trainee Producer will play a key role in the successful planning and delivery of Bristol Old Vic's programme. This includes in-house productions and projects, coproductions, tours and the presentation of a wide range of visiting work.

Assistant Produce Main House Productions

- Work with directors on recruitment of creative teams, checking availability of freelance artists, making offers to creatives, and working alongside the Producers to ensure overall balance and diversity of creative teams.
- Attend production meetings, read throughs, rehearsals, technical rehearsals and previews as required.
- Prepare and issue contracts (using existing contract templates) for in-house productions, liaising with agents and artists as required.
- From time to time, to support freelance casting directors as appropriate in checking availabilities, booking auditions and meetings, and ensuring responses are given to everyone who auditions.
- Book accommodation and travel for actors, stage managers and creatives working on the show as required.
- Support the administration of the press nights (including be present at Bristol Old Vic on press night) with tasks such as assigning guest tickets, preparing company gifts and cards, liaising with comms and operations teams to ensure the smooth running of the evening.
- Work with the Company Stage Manager and HR team to ensure appropriate paperwork is collected for all freelance artists working at Bristol Old Vic.
- Support on the Producing administration of all shows as required.

Programming

- Support the programming of the main house and studio by reading scripts and proposals, watching rehearsed readings and contributing ideas and feedback to programming meetings.
- Update internal diaries when shows are confirmed to ensure all information is up to date.
- Manage the programming@ and invites@ email inboxes, responding to enquiries, prioritizing proposals to take to the programming meetings and distributing invitations to the wider programming team.

Key Duties and Responsibilities

Programming (continued)

- Take minutes at programming and producing meetings when required.
- Program one- and two-night short runs and comedy events in the main house and foyer; finding
 appropriate shows, negotiating financial deals, issuing deal memos and contracts (using existing
 templates), acting as the chief point of contact in advance of the show and working with the
 finance team to deliver financial settlements after the event.

Budget creation and management

- Help the Producers in the preparation of quarterly financial reports and summary budgets comparing forecast and actual expenditure and income.
- Support the producing and finance teams in managing weekly payroll and tracking credit card expenditure.
- Code and process invoices for main house and studio work, ensuring show budgets are always up to date.

Person Specification

- A passion for theatre generally and the work of Bristol Old Vic theatre in particular.
- Excellent administrative and organisational skills, confident in juggling multiple priorities and
- prioritising effectively to meet deadlines.
- Excellent communication skills, both written and verbal.
- Proactive and able to work on one's own initiative.
- Excellent IT skills with good knowledge of Word and Excel programs.
- A commitment to Diversity and Inclusion and helping to make Bristol Old Vic a great place to work for all employees and artists.
- Some office administration experience or experience working in an arts organisation is ideal but not essential.
- Be based in, or willing to relocate to, Bristol or the South West.
