About STAGE ONE



Stage One is a charity that has supported theatre producers and productions through educational and investment schemes for over 40 years through a series of developmental programmes ranging from practical workshops to financial awards.

Stage One offers a variety of development programmes for emerging commercial producers. As well as offering paid placements we run 3 annual workshops, we offer bursary of up to £20k, and offer underrepresented producers access to our Bridge the Gap development programme. We also provide investment to producers on both small scale and larger commercial investment.

Stage One Producer Placements

The Stage One Producer Placements offer aspiring producers the opportunity to work within an established production company or producing theatre. They are employed by the organisation for 12 months, learning the producer role through hand-on training. Stage One launched the national branch of this scheme in 2013 in order to increase communication and shared knowledge across the subsidised and commercial sectors. The placement not only benefits the producer, but also the host theatre/ organisation as they have further opportunity and support to produce inhouse.

Since 2006 Stage One have facilitated:

- 120 paid placements in West End commercial producing offices to 87 producers
- 38 paid placements in national theatres and host venues (launched in 2013)
- 4 Bridge the Gap placements at Talawa
 Theatre Company (2021-22), Gate Theatre
 (2022-23), Leeds Playhouse (2023-24) and Lyric
 Hammersmith Theatre (2024-25).

About The Role



Key Duties and Responsibilities

The Trainee Producer will play a vital role in supporting the innovation of our business and operating model, by working closely with and supporting the Artistic Director, Head of Producing and the artistic planning department to realise the artistic aims of Northern Stage. The Trainee Producer would be part of the artistic planning department; the department is responsible for coordinating the full performance programme, talent development activity for post-HE and professional artists, and acts as the central point of communication for all performance activity within the company. The Trainee Producer would work across the full performance programme, with a particular focus on coordinating visiting companies, creative residencies, access, and Northern Stage's produced work.

DUTIES

- To support the artistic planning team to realise the full performance programme at Northern Stage
- To support the artistic planning team to realise Northern Stage productions, co-productions and tours including coordinating casting and availability checks, arranging auditions and production meetings, liaising with agents and drafting contracts, and researching and obtaining performance rights for plays.
- To support the artistic planning team in programming visiting companies in Stage 1, 2 and 3, acting as the first point of contact for all programming enquiries, assisting with contractual negotiations and helping to ensure visiting companies receive an incomparable welcome.
- To support the Artistic Director & the Head of Producing on the development and delivery of the artistic development programme, coordinating the planning and liaising with artists and other departments
- To coordinate and manage access performances with the artistic planning team across both produced and visiting work
- To work with the artistic planning team to ensure that visiting companies, performers and creatives are welcomed appropriately
- To work with the participation team to support the interface between all creative activity
- With the Theatre Administrator, coordinate programming meetings and disseminate information regarding the programme internally.
- To keep the organisation's diary (YesPlan) up to date with all programming decisions
- Any other duties as may be reasonably required by the Artistic Director,
 Executive Director and artistic planning team
